The focus of this workshop includes aspects of ASL that are particularly helpful when working in and with a visual language. Application of these strategies can assist with the clarity of transliteration, interpretation, and visual communication in general. Topics that will be covered in this workshop include the following: use of space, modulation of verbs, pronoun usage, modulation for physical semantic features, classifiers, plurals, role shift/characterization, and transitions. Activities for this workshop center around practical application of the principles discussed, using materials specially selected for each skill area.

Sharon Newman Solow works as an interpreter, interpreter coordinator, performer, lecturer and consultant. Her career has taken her around the United States, and to Canada, Mexico, Europe, Scandinavia, New Zealand, and Australia. She is the author of two books, Sign Language Interpreting: A Basic Resource Book (Newly revised!) and Say It With Sign along with a number of professional articles and handbooks. She is the 1987 recipient of the national Virginia Hughes Award for outstanding contributions to the field of sign language interpreting.
